


## **Adjutant's Corner**


#### **Webmaster's and Newsletter Editor's Corner**

# National Vietnam Veterans Day and Our Vietnam Veterans Dinner By Jeff Punches

On March 29th, we celebrated National Vietnam Veterans Day with a special Vietnam Veterans Dinner at VFW Post 4031. It was a free event open to all veterans and community members who wanted to come together and honor our fallen comrades. The Dinner is always one of the most important events of the year.

Et Voila Catering and Chef Amy brought us a Cajun-inspired feast, featuring blackened chicken, gumbo, salad, cornbread, and two delicious desserts. Over 100 people attended, and it was a resounding success! The Daughters of the American Revolution also helped out by serving food and the VFW Post 4031 Auxiliary helped by setting up the tables and chairs prior to the dinner.

Jeff Punches was our emcee again, and we had a great time listening to a short talk about the Vietnam Women's Memorial Statue near the Vietnam Veterans Memorial (The Wall). Jeff also gave tribute to the eight women who died serving in Vietnam and whose names are memorialized on the Wall. Their names and a short history of the Women's Memorial are contained later in this newsletter. We also had the honor of having General Ronald Fogelman, the former Chief of Staff of the Air Force, as our keynote speaker. General Fogelman gave an incredible history of the Vietnam War and the valuable lessons our Armed Forces learned from it. His address was certainly the high point of the evening.

The dinner was made possible by the hard work of the VFW Post 4031 Auxiliary, Bronwyn Covert, Kent Ewing, and Jessica Fairchild. Bronwyn took care of everything from hospitality to floor management, Kent, our esteemed DJ provided the music, and Jessica sang the National Anthem. We couldn't have done it without them!

## Women on the Wall By Jeff Punches

Eight women, all nurses, are among the more than 58,000 names on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

Most were killed in airplane or helicopter crashes. Only one was killed by enemy fire. First Lieutenant Sharon Ann Lane, an Army nurse listed on Panel 23 West, Line 112, was killed during a rocket attack on June 8, 1969, less than 10 weeks after she arrived in Vietnam. Assigned to the 312th Evacuation Hospital, Lane was working in the Vietnamese ward of the hospital when the rocket exploded, killing her and her patients. She was from Canton, Ohio.

Overall, more than 265,000 women served in some capacity during the Vietnam War — and approximately 10,000 military women served in-country during the conflict.

It is a common misconception that all women serving in Vietnam were nurses. Barred from combat, military women served in health care, communications, intelligence, and administrative positions.

All had to be volunteers, and like their male counterparts, they volunteered for a variety of reasons: duty to one's country, a desire to help those serving overseas, or an interest in advancing one's military career, to name a few.

Civilian women also volunteered and served as foreign news correspondents, worked for organizations such as the American Red Cross, Army Special Services, United Service Organizations USO), Peace Corps, and various religious groups such as Catholic Relief Services, or served in other government agencies.

Jeff Punches provided a brief description of each of the military nurses who are on the Wall. Here are brief descriptions of those women for those who missed the Dinner.



#### **Eleanor Grace Alexander**

Captain Eleanor Grace Alexander, U.S. Army had been working in a hospital in Pleiku to help out during mass casualties from Dak To when her plane crashed on the return trip to Qui Nhon on November 30, 1967. She was with the 85th Evacuation Hospital. She was from New Jersey and is remembered on Panel 31E Line 8. Dorothy Donovan





### **Pamela Dorothy Donovan**

Lieutenant Pamela Dorothy Donovan, U.S. Army died of pneumonia on July 8, 1968. Born in Ireland, she was assigned to the 85th Evacuation Hospital in Qui Nhon. 2LT Donovan is remembered on Panel 53W, Line 43.



#### **Carol Ann Elizabeth Drazba**

2nd Lieutenant Carol Ann Elizabeth Drazba, U.S. Army was killed in a helicopter crash near Saigon on February 18, 1966. Born and raised in Pennsylvania, she is remembered on Panel 5E, Line 46.



#### Annie Ruth Graham

Lieutenant Colonel Annie Ruth Graham, U.S. Army suffered a stroke on August 14, 1968. She was from North Carolina and was the Chief Nurse with the 91st Evacuation Hospital in Tuy Hoa. Her name can be found on Panel 48W. Line 12.



#### **Elizabeth Ann Jones**

2nd Lieutenant Elizabeth Ann Jones, U.S. Army was flying with 2LT Drazba and was killed in the same helicopter crash near Saigon. She was assigned to the 3rd Field Hospital. 2LT Jones was from South Carolina and is remembered on Panel 5E Line 47.



#### **Mary Therese Klinker**

Captain Mary Therese Klinker, U.S. Air Force was part of an on-board medical team during Operation Babylift. Her flight was carrying 243 infants and children when it developed pressure problems and crashed while attempting to return to the airport. Captain Klinker was killed on April 4, 1975, just three weeks before the Fall of Saigon. A native of Indiana, she is remembered on Panel 1W. Line 122.






#### **Sharon Ann Lane**

Ist Lieutenant Sharon Ann Lane, U.S. Army was killed by a rocket explosion on June 8, 1969, less than 10 weeks after she arrived in Vietnam. Assigned to the 312th Evacuation Hospital, ILT Lane was working in the Vietnamese ward of the hospital when the rocket exploded, killing her and her patients. She was from Ohio and her name can be found on Panel 23W. Line 112.



#### **Hedwig Diane Orlowski**

Ist Lieutenant Hedwig Diane Orlowski, U.S. Army was onboard with Capt. Alexander when their plane crashed on its return trip to Qui Nhon. She was assigned to the 67th Evacuation Hospital, ILT Orlowski was from Michigan. She is remembered on Panel 31E, Line 15...

## The Vietnam Women's Memorial By Jeff Punches

The Vietnam Women's Memorial was added to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Site and dedicated on November 11, 1993.

In late 1983, Diane Carlson Evans, a nurse who served in the Army in Vietnam, conceived of the idea to add a statue to the Memorial site to honor the women who served. She incorporated the Vietnam Women's Memorial Project (VWMP) in 1984. In 2002, the group changed its name to the Vietnam Women's Memorial Foundation (VWMF).

The memorial was established not only to honor those women who served, but also for the families who lost loved ones in the war, so they would know about the women who provided comfort, care, and a human touch for those who were suffering and dying.

Sculpted by Glenna Goodacre, the 2,000 pound, 6-foot 8-inch sculpture portrays three women, one of whom is caring for a wounded male soldier. In the surrounding site, eight yellowwood trees were planted to symbolize the eight women whose names are on The Wall.

Diane Carlson Evans recounts the effort to build the Vietnam Women's Memorial in her book Healing Wounds, A Vietnam War combat nurse's 10-year fight to win women a place of honor in Washington, D.C.

# VFW Post 4031 Auxiliary Officer's Corner



# VFW Post 4031 Youth Scholarships

The annual youth scholarship programs began on April Ist. These two programs enable us to award scholarship support to our local High and Middle School Students. Tracy Padilla heads up our efforts to get the word out to our local students. The two scholarship programs are the Voice of Democracy which is directed to High School Students, and the Patriot's Pen which is directed to our Junior High School students. The following describes these two scholarship programs in more detail.

## **Voice of Democracy**

Established in 1947, the Voice of Democracy is a audio-essay program that offers high school students a unique opportunity to express themselves through a recorded essay on a democratic and patriotic theme. Each year, over 26,400 ninth through twelfth-grade students from across the nation participate in the program, vying for their share of more than \$1.4 million in educational scholarships and incentives.

The national first-place winner receives a \$35,000 scholarship, which is directly deposited into the recipient's American university, college, or vocational/technical school. A comprehensive list of other national scholarships ranges from \$1,000 to \$21,000. Additionally, the first-place winner from each VFW Department (state) is awarded at least a scholarship of \$1,000. Students interested in participating must submit their audio essay prepared for this year's theme, along with a completed 2025-2026 entry form, to VFW Post 4031.

The 2025–26 theme is: "How Are You Showing Patriotism and Support for Our Country?"

#### Patriot's Pen

Each year, over 60,600 students in sixth through eighth grades participate in the VFW's Patriot's Pen® annual youth essay contest, seeking a chance to win their share of nearly \$1 million in state and national awards. Each first-place state winner receives a minimum of \$500 at the national level, while the national first-place winner is awarded \$5,000.

The essay contest invites young minds to explore America's history and their own experiences in contemporary American society by composing a 300- to 400-word essay. The essay should express the author's views based on a patriotic theme selected by the VFW Commander-in-Chief. Interested students must submit their essay, prepared on this year's theme, along with a completed 2025-2026 entry form, to VFW Post 4031.

The theme for the 2025–26 essay contest is: "How Are You Demonstrating Patriotism and Providing Support for Our Country?"

If you know a student tell them about these scholarships.

# Home Care Support for Veterans By Erin Youngblood

Many veterans may not be aware that they can receive in-home care services at no cost through

VA benefits. These services are designed to support veterans in maintaining their independence and quality of life at home. Care may include assistance with medication management, daily living activities, light housekeeping, meal preparation, and companionship. For veterans like Jim, a Vietnam War veteran, these services have been life-changing. After struggling with mobility issues, Jim found it difficult to keep up with household tasks and daily routines. Through a VA home care referral, he was connected with a caregiver who now helps him with meal prep, personal care, light cleaning, and staying active. "Having someone here makes all the difference," Jim shares. "It allows me to stay in my home and live comfortably."

Accessing these benefits starts with a conversation with a provider at the VA clinic. Veterans can request a home care referral, which allows them to receive personalized support based on their needs.


